

LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S NOVEMBER 2020 REPORT

As this year ends, Newaygo Area District Library is grateful to include you among the library's supporters. We hope we can count on you this year for a donation to benefit the library mission in our community. In past years, individuals and organizations have supported the Library in the areas of:

Empowerment: NADL's digital inclusion efforts provide free 24/7 high-speed internet access in and around the facility and availability of hotspot devices to access data away from the library. Digital inclusion means all people have access to the information necessary for education, employment, lifelong learning, and essential services.

Education: The library provides summer and winter reading programs that historically reach over 700 people a year, providing them with engaging literacy programming and free books of choice. The collections of materials are constantly updated to include current topics and titles.

Engagement: The library hosts monthly classes, lectures, and events for children, youth and adults to pursue such activities as watercolor painting, doodling and drawing, crafting, self-defense, photography, author and lecture series, and most recently, two science and local history classes titled, "Metal DETECTING Our History."

Exploration: The library's expanding "More Than Books Collection" now includes three mobile hotspots, four metal detectors and equipment, ten digital cameras, Ozobots and Lego S.T.E.M. kits, puzzles, games, and Launchpads, allowing all people regardless of income to pursue new interests and develop their passions.

Economy: The library provides ten public computers for online resources, private conference and study rooms, and current reference materials for those seeking to develop a business or become employable in the community. Even during restricted service times, the library keeps public computers available for residents to complete essential tasks online.

- ✓ Capira app is nearing release!


✓ Discussions are ongoing to develop policy and procedures to allow Non-Resident cardholders access to local library digital collectors.


7. Friends of the Library.


