Hello! Our library was founded as Newaygo Carnegie Library in 1915 and has served our area for over 100 years. The founders' original vision was to create a hub where the community could come together, share and learn. In today's connected world, it's easy to forget that libraries still serve as a place for people to come together. Our library has evolved just like society around us, providing digital material and access to the latest technology to assist everyone from children to job seekers to senior adults. What has not changed, however, is that we are a place for families and neighbors to come together.

The heart of any library relies on people. We have approximately 7000 people in our service area, but only about 50% hold an account at the library. We want to increase that number, and we know it is important that we reach out and connect with local organizations, civic groups, and governments. Our goal is to increase awareness of our services and improve communication with other community groups.

Although we are supported through a millage, a library only thrives if the community embraces it. Our motto is Gather, Connect, Explore, and we strive to be a place where our community feels as at home with us as they do in their own living room.
