


Director's July 2021 Report



We want to keep kids, teens and adults engaged in reading their entire lives. Summer Reading Programs at NADL are designed to encourage fun and intriguing discoveries to challenge readers to read, log their progress, achieve personal goals, and win great prizes. Every year, we see circulation rates climb steeply as people visit the library to sign up and read. This year, our program was called, Tails and Tales. Over 500 people participated! What great fun to see everyone visiting the library to find their next great read, or to collect a prize coupon to local businesses, or to just hang out with their family for a while during a hot day.

Summer Reading Programs are also essential to encourage reluctant younger readers to read! One way we do this is through hosting 11 different discovery presentations geared toward kids and teens to stimulate interests they may have never considered. Kids learned about slap-stick comedy, story-telling, animals, drumming, science, self-defense, yoga and Jiu-jitsu, and doodling. Exposure to these programs encouraged kids to check out books related to the subjects. Allowing kids to choose what interests them is a powerful incentive that builds literacy in the individual. Newaygo Library is the perfect place for our youngest residents to explore and develop lifelong learning habits.

Our community recognizes how important summer reading is to our residents. The Fremont Area Community Foundation provided a \$6,500 grant to the library for these programs. This year, over \$3,050 of support and reading prizes were also donated from over 30 area businesses! The library is humbled and grateful for the overwhelming support and generosity. Rewarding readers of all ages creates pride in their reading achievements. People of all ages that complete Summer Reading will see themselves as readers. That attitude of accomplishment is what is needed in every individual to create a positive and enriched life.
