Newaygo Area District Library was founded as Newaygo Carnegie Library in 1915 and has served our surrounding community for over 100 years. The founders' original vision was to create a local hub where the community could come together, share and explore. In 2012-13, Newaygo Area District Library renovated that historic Carnegie library building and enlarged the facility to what it is today.

When you realize the dream of people from the 1910's is still around and making an impact on our local residents today...wow!



<u>This Giving Tuesday, Nov 30</u>, we are seeking generous partners that have chosen to make a gift this year to support a strong, vibrant library community here in Newaygo. Through your generous donations, opportunity exists for the library to raise \$5,000 that could be applied upon the principal of our library building bond. This bond is scheduled to be paid off in the year 2030. But imagine the possibilities if we were able to raise funds annually to reduce the principal remaining on our building loan!

What would the future look like if we were able to accomplish this? Once the debt was alleviated, approximately \$40,000 annually would be freed-up to enlarge the library's ability to provide services and resources to you, our valuable members of our community.





December Feature Author: Brené Brown, Ph.D.

"In Atlas of the Heart, Brown takes us on a journey through eighty-seven of the emotions and experiences that define what it means to be human. As she maps the necessary skills and an actionable framework for meaningful connection, she gives us the language and tools to access a universe of new choices and second chances—a universe where we can share and steward the stories of our bravest and most heartbreaking moments with one another in a way that builds connection.

Over the past two decades, Brown's extensive research into the experiences that make us who we are has shaped the cultural conversation and helped define what it means to be courageous with our lives. *Atlas of the Heart* draws on this research, as well as on Brown's singular skills as a storyteller, to show us how accurately naming an experience doesn't give the experience more power, it gives *us* the power of understanding, meaning, and choice.



6. Lakeland Library Cooperative.


