

Director's November Report

Newaygo Area District Library seeks to be the local community space to gather, connect and explore. It is encouraging to see how patrons frequent the library, checkout library collections materials, and participate in library events despite the impact of Covid-19 on day-to-day life. One area of library service demonstrating the most resilience despite times of library shutdowns and limited hours was use of electronic collections. On average in 2021, our patrons checked-out 432 electronic formatted materials each month, quite a climb from the pre-Covid average check-outs of 303 per month.

As we sought to provide our community access to vibrant collection of current topics and titles, Newaygo Library began purchasing hoopla resources in May of 2021. On the hoopla platform, patrons instantly borrow e-books, audiobooks, movies & television shows, music and graphic novels.



Now hoopla introduces <u>BingePass</u>, a brand-new experience that gives Newaygo Library patrons unlimited streaming of great online content for 7 days with just a single hoopla Instant borrow.

BingePass is a new format on hoopla — patrons can browse it just like they would browse audiobooks, eBooks, movies, etc. They'll find it with the "More" button in hoopla's bottom navigation on a mobile device.

BingePass has launched with:






The library is open for walk-in and by appointments for curbside pick-up. Social distancing is recommended and wearing of facemasks is welcome but not required.
