

Director's Report

One of Newaygo Library's goals in our community is to be a gathering place for people to experience lifelong growth, cultural enrichment and education. One way we do this is by providing group reading opportunities. Preschool Story-time and TW/TN Pizza & Pages are two children's reading clubs you may recognize. But what about opportunities for adults? Newaygo Library has an Adult Book Club, too. Since 2021, our Adult Book Club participants have read several book titles independently, and then gathered at the library or local restaurants for deeper discussions.

Why are book clubs so important?

BOOK CLUBS CREATE AN ENJOYMENT OF LITERATURE IN A POSITIVE ENVIRONMENT AND ENCOURAGE CRITICAL THINKING AND DEEPER ENGAGEMENT WITH OTHERS OVER THE STORIES.

A book club is a forum where readers from many different backgrounds and experiences come together to mull over aspects about the story to understand deeper conclusions and to expand conversation and social empathy.

The next Adult Book Club book title will be <u>The Diamond Eye</u> by Kate Quinn, author of the New York Times bestselling book, <u>The Rose Code</u>.



<u>The Diamond Eye</u> is an unforgettable World War II tale of a quiet bookworm who becomes history's deadliest female sniper. It is based on a true story.

The book will release on March 29. The Library will have several books available in different formats for checkout. We will meet as a group on May 18th at 3:30 pm in the NADL Conference Room to discuss the story AND to <u>share with author Kate Quinn via Zoom</u>. This is a unique opportunity to delve into life in Ukraine during the Nazi invasion, and to discuss deeper conclusions with fellow readers and the author herself. Please reserve the date on your calendar and place a library book hold for your copy to read. You will not be disappointed! We look forward to seeing you soon.




