



Director's Report

In August 2021, Newaygo Area District Library (NADL) was awarded an American Rescue Plan Act Grant (ARPA) provided by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) through the Library of Michigan (LM). APRA funding helped the Michigan library community to support their communities by responding to pandemic needs as well as related economic needs.

The grant of \$41,456 was awarded to NADL to provide digital access for the Newaygo community. This project sought to reduce the digital gap by meeting two goals:

Goal One: To provide additional free public WIFI access points 24/7 in the community of Newaygo. The library installed equipment to boost the facility's WIFI into areas in front and behind the building, thereby providing patrons with an outdoor library experience with digital accessibility even when the library was closed. The plans included placement of two picnic tables in front of the library in the patio area to complement the existing gazebo. The final step to completing this goal will be to install equipment to cast library WIFI into most of Brooks Park, adjacent to the library and city complex.

To further improve connectivity, the library recently placed three WIFI-enabled, solar-powered charging benches in downtown Newaygo. Placement of these benches extended the digital reach of the library beyond its campus, thereby providing 24/7 connectivity to downtown residents, local restaurant and business traffic; and to tourists and business travelers. In cooperation with the City, one bench was placed at Linda's Chapel near the Newaygo Post Office; one was placed near Timbertown Coffee Co.; and the third was installed in front of the renovated Newaygo County Museum & Heritage Center. These benches allow users to charge their devices by plugging in or through touch-free charging. Each is able to simultaneously connect up to 16 devices at a time to free WIFI.

Goal Two: To provide local students and residents the ability to access WIFI from home by borrowing laptops and hot-spot devices from the library. In Newaygo County, only 67.9% of homes have access to broadband. During the pandemic, most students and employees worked remotely from home. The inequity of connectivity impacted those most who were without dependable access. The library used grant funds to purchase eleven laptops for residents to check-out along with hot-spots for connectivity on the go. With a library card, any resident in need may have access to the technology and accessibility needed to complete their educational, employment and lifelong learning development needs.

As completion of this grant project draws near, we are grateful to IMLS and LM for providing these funds to help NADL bring exciting new technology and connect-ability to our Newaygo community.


