


Director's Report

## 2023 Michigan Notable Books

Annually, the Library of Michigan chooses up to twenty of the most notable books published in the prior year. Each selection must be either written by a Michigan resident or be about Michigan or the Great Lakes. As State Librarian Randy Riley has said, "The *Michigan Notable Books* selections clearly demonstrate the diverse tapestry of subject matter that Michigan offers to inspire writers. Everyone will find something of interest that speaks to their lives or experiences in our great state."



The Michigan Notable Books annual program has roots stretching back to Michigan Week 1991. In 2004, the name changed from Read Michigan to Michigan Notable Books. In 2002, The Michigan Department of History, Arts, and Libraries took over Read Michigan and Michigan Week. In October 2009, The Library of Michigan migrated to The Michigan Department of Education, bringing the Michigan Notable Books program with it. The Michigan Notable Books program is sponsored in part by the Library of Michigan Foundation, Michigan Center for the Book, and Michigan Humanities.







Books are available in the upper level of the Library or on Libby. We will meet as a discussion group in the Conference Room.




