

#### Hello from the New NADL Director:





# NOVEMBER ADULT BOOK CLUB: Thurs. November 9<sup>th</sup> 2:00 pm

This month our book is: *Firekeeper's Daughter* by award winning author, and the Great Michigan Read author of 2023-2024, Angeline Boulley.

This book is about eighteen-year-old Daunis Fontaine, who has never quite fit in, both in her hometown and on the nearby Ojibwe reservation. She dreams of a fresh start at college, but when family tragedy strikes, Daunis puts her future on hold to look after her fragile mother. As the deceptions – and deaths – keep growing, Daunis must learn what it means to be a strong Anishinaabe kwe (Ojibwe woman) and how far she'll go for her community, even if it tears apart the only world she's ever known.

The book display is at the front desk of the library for adults to check out. Space is limited. September 20, 2023 – October 18 there is access to unlimited downloads of the e-book and audiobook!

CHILDREN'S DECEMBER - TAKE & MAKE: Mon. December 11<sup>th</sup> - Sat. 16<sup>th</sup>



- ✓ Oct 11: Bishops Heating & Cooling was called to service the furnace located on the top of the flat roof. A faulty part must be replaced and is on order. Also, the insurance claim against the A/C units which were tampered with was received.
- ✓ Oct 18: Bishops Heating and Cooling serviced roof top heat unit and replaced faulty inducer motor.
- ✓ Oct 18: Statistics ran on Consumer Energy reports show a total savings of \$822.84 and 2,854.44 kWH since upgrading to LED lights in December of 2022. This was despite the average kWH per \$1 falling from 5.93 kWH/\$1 to 5.48 kWH/\$1 (See Attached Stats Page).
- ✓ Nov. 22: Scheduled to have Foster Electric come to service the electric of the 3 emergency combo lights at our three exits.
