

2023–24 Great Michigan Read Book Choice





 - ✓ Aug 2: Bishops Heating & Cooling performed maintenance on the 4 A/C units and furnaces. Two units on ground level appeared to have been tampered with, having had internal wiring unplugged. One unit required replacement of a burned-out compressor as a result of the tampering. A police report was filed, and an insurance claim was made.
 - ✓ Aug. 12: Jason Howell of Pioneer Construction removed debris from the flat roof over the lobby.
 - ✓ Aug. 24: J. Stevens patched several spots on the flat roof.
 - ✓ Aug. 25: After several weeks of intermittent service from AT&T for our alarm panel communications, Johnson Controls/Simplex Grinnell technician serviced our panel; concluded there was nothing wrong with the equipment, but if the connection to the tower falls below three bars, it will cause an alarm event notifying that communications with the control center had been broken.
